So you cross this ghastly mass of asphalt with the sun beating down

and the heat of the ground beating up behind 24th Street Elementary School and then suddenly you are in paradise! Luscious trees, beds of plants and

herbs, cozy hideaway corners, shady nooks, fruit and flowers everywhere and you can hardly



believe your eyes. Children are dashing around and then they all sit down together (rare in USA) to eat --- wait for it --- kale salad (among other things)!!!!



These are children who are in a situation where they have very little and will never have many opportunities. They have hardly ever been in the natural world and normally will never go. They live in what is called a Food Desert, a large section of LA where people are too poor to be able to afford fresh food and so none is available.



The 10 Freeway was built, the neighbourhood was abandoned and the school sunk into ruins. The parents got together and

demanded the school be re-instated and they won. A large budget was ear-marked to re-asphalt the area behind the school but the parents requested a garden instead. Unfortunately the budget was not given to the development of the garden..... This was all in 2005.
